Purpose

PHR Council aims to contribute to the enhancement of public health and safety by promoting the proper dissemination of Personal Health Records (PHR) through information sharing and communication.

The term "PHR" as used here refers to a system that enables individuals to utilize data related to medical care, Healthcare, long term care, and wellness, and wellness—data generated in connection with their daily lives (Person Generated Data)—based on their own decisions.



Individuals and families can choose the most suitable PHR service based on their own decisions, and essential information can be transferred between services.




Realizing data flow for PHR services

► Collaboration and Networking Committee

Mission: Promote Collaboration Among Members

► Special Committee on The Role of PHR in Large-Scale Disasters Committee


Mission: To identify and organize the challenges related to the role of PHR in large-scale disasters, make recommendations for preparedness during normal times, and promote social implementation to enable effective utilization during emergencies.

- A survey will be conducted targeting disaster survivors, supporters, relevant government agencies, and experts in affected areas, including those impacted by the Noto Peninsula Earthquake. The aim is to conceptualize a world where PHR is utilized during disasters, develop policy recommendations, and implement these ideas in society.
- If any requests for support arise from the Noto Peninsula earthquake-affected areas during the course of the survey, necessary assistance will be coordinated through the voluntary efforts of supporting and special members.



▶ Special Committee for Guideline Development

Based on the national guidelines, this committee organizes and presents the rules and standards that should be observed by PHR service providers. It is responsible for the development and dissemination of the guidelines.





Purpose of the PHR Service Guidelines

Based on the national guidelines, the purpose is to organize and present the rules and standards that PHR service providers should follow, in order to further improve the quality, effectiveness, and safety of PHR services. This will contribute to the promotion of health for both individuals and society through the use of health information, and support the growth of the PHR industry.

Definition of PHR Services

A PHR service refers to a service that utilizes health and medical information to support disease prevention and health promotion for the public and patients. It includes at least one of the following functions: recommendation, data management/viewing, or third-party data provision. The data management/viewing function also encompasses the collection of health information through wearable devices and similar tools.

Examples of possible uses include the following purposes:

- When individuals use the service for purposes such as health promotion
- · When insurers, local governments, or companies encourage residents or employees to use the service as part of health guidance or health management initiatives
- When medical institutions encourage patients to use the service for health management purposes



Ten Fundamental Principles for Providing PHR Services

- 1. Concepts of PHR and PGD (Person-Generated Data)
- 2. Prevention of disease and promotion of health through self-care support using daily life data
- 3. Improving the quality of medical care by utilizing related data
- 4. Ensuring the health, safety, and rights of PHR service users
- 5. Providing services based on **user Imformed consent**
- 6. Ensuring and enhancing the quality of PHR services
- 7. Collaboration among PHR service providers
- 8. Increasing beneficiaries through market expansion, promoting public health and productivity
- 9. Establishing a framework that allows for continuous updates
- 10. Developing rules for PHR service provision in line with **global trends**
